## NAVIGATIONAL SCATTER Friday 24th January 2025

Blaclpalfrey Motor Club of Kent is organising a Navigational Scatter event on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> January 2025. Start and Finish will be at The Stag Inn on the A262 at Challock, GR 189/01155085, starting at 19.30 and finishing at 22.00. This will be a basic navigation event using 8 figure map references and will be suitable for beginners, novices and experts alike. It is an opportunity to learn or enhance your map reading skills. You will need an MSUK RS Clubmans licence (Free), pencils, eraser, pen and good torch. A magnifier and a romer are very useful if you have them.

## Supplementary Regulations.

1.Blackpalfrey Mpotor Club of Kent will organise a navigational Scatter event on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> January 2025.

2. The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the MSUK, these supplementary regulations and any written instructions the organiser may issue for the event.

3. A permit has been issued, number TBA.

4. The event is open to members of Blackpalfrey MC and the Weald MC.

5. The event is not part of any championship.

6. All competitors must produce a valid club membership card and a current MSUK RS Clubmans licence.

7. Start and Finish venue is The Stag Inn, Challock, GR 189/01155085.

8. Entries open on publication of these regulations and close on 24<sup>th</sup> January 2025, Signing on opens at 19.30 and closes at 19.50. There will be a crew briefing at 19.50 after which route instructions will be available. The event will finish at 22.00 and results will be published as soon as possible after that.

9. There will be two classes, beginners and experts. A Beginner is defined as a crew whose members have never competed in any form of navigational motorsport. An Expert is any other crew.

10. All vehicles must comply with MSUK Technical Regulations. Any vehicle found to contravene these regulations during the course of the event will be excluded.

11. Any vehicle considered to be excessively noisy will be prohibited from continuing on the event.

12. Lighting is free but dipped beam must be used in populated areas.

13. Entreis must be made on the official entry form which can be found on the Blackpalfrey MC website, <u>www.blackpalfrey.co.uk</u>. The entry fee is £10 per car.

14. Officials. The organiser is Peter Boyce, at <a href="mailto:pandiboyce@btinternet.com">pandiboyce@btinternet.com</a> or 01303 892680.

15. The maximum entry is 20 and the minimum 6. If this number is not reached, the event will not run. Entries will be received in a first come first served basis.

16. There will be no awards.

17. Results will be announced as soon as possible after the finish.

18. There is no common route but crews should have enough fuel for 70 miles to be sure.

19. No Final Instructions will be issued.

20. Route instructions will be in the form of a set of map references with a set of questions related to each location. At each location visited crews should answer the relevant question in writing. At some locations this may involve getting out of the car.

21. Crews must plan their own route but must not visit more than 75% of the locations given.

22. Penalties and Points.

a) For providing proof of having visited a location by providing the correct answer, **the points** value for the location.

b) For reporting at the Finish after 22.00, 1 point per minute late deducted.

c) For reporting to the Finish after 22.15, deemed to have retired.

d) For entering a Black Spot, Exclusion.

e) For driving in a manner likely to bring motorsport into disrepute, **Exclusion**.

f) Ties will be resolved by a means decided by the organiser.

23. The decisions of the organiser are final and no protests will be allowed.
