At the last Hughes Organising Team meeting we filled all but one of the vacant posts. Si Kellow (MMKMC) has taken on the role of Event Coordinator, and I know he will be just right for that post, having been the promotor of Kent Royals Speedway team in the past few years.

Andy Jenner (MMKMC) has agreed to buddy up with Grahame Standen (BPMCK) to be Joint chief Marshal, Bill Cook (BPMCK) has taken on the role of Entries Secretary. Harry Pace (BPMCK) has returned to the role of Driving Standards Officer. There remained the post of Secretary of the meeting to be filled.

Si has subsequently spoken to Mark Baulch of Southern Car Club who has agreed to take on the role of Secretary of the Meeting. Si, Mark and I have had a Zoom meeting, and I am, again, confident that Mark is the right



man for the job. He has a wealth of experience in running events up to international level and has been a regular competitor in various types of events over many years. He is the coordinator for the ASCMC Tarmac Rally Series.

Now that all the posts are filled, at the next Hughes meeting I will hand over the reins to Si as the new Coordinator and I will step away from the Hughes organising team.

I think everyone who met up at The Pilot for the fish & chip supper enjoyed the evening – supplemented by excellent weather. The journey home at dusk was interesting, with every insect in the world on the wing over the RSPCA gravel pits. I had to stop twice to clean the windscreen!

Our September club night (11th) will be the first of a series of rally training nights run under the Weald banner. We will be hosting the evening, and it is not about plotting a route, but will concentrate on putting two people (students) into a car with a pre-plotted route and letting them find their way round it. The emphasis will be on the navigator reading the map and communicating the route to the driver. We are aiming to have 2 experienced people sitting in the back of their car – a driver and navigator (tutors), so that they can help and guide the students.

We are running this with the blessing of MSUK and they are giving us a block permit for the series of training evenings which will finish in the Spring with a 12-car rally specifically for the students. Whilst other organisations put on one day training events, this is the first free series in the UK as far as I know.

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Autotests: Part One Grahame Standen gives us the lowdown on grass autotests

Anyone who's active in our Facebook group will hopefully have noticed that I try to promote Autotests run locally by other clubs in the Weald Motor Club group, but what are Autotests? Let me give you a brief outline description...




Autotests are driving tests timed to the 10th of a second around a course set out with road cones or poles on a grass or tarmac/concrete surface. Grass events usually take place in the summer when ground conditions allow either during the light weekday evenings or a full day at weekends, hard surface events can be held all year round but tend to be slightly biased to the winter months. For this article, I'm just going to deal with the grass variety.

As a member of the Weald Motor Club group Blackpalfrey members have an option to compete on about 15 evening events and 3 or 4, maybe 5 all day events, so there are a few options to choose from. All you need is your club membership card and the free MSUK Clubman licence together with a car. Costs are £20 to £25 for the evening events and £30 to £40 for the all-day ones plus a bit of fuel for the event and travel. Most events have a junior category open to anyone 14 and over, there are some limitations on car performance here and they must be accompanied by an adult, but often the entry fee is reduced or even free. Classes can also be available for regular drivers to carry a passenger, and this can be of assistance in remembering the correct route.

All events have classes for various types of cars; saloon/hatchback, sports, front or rear wheel drive etc, with subdivisions according to physical size but not engine capacity as the events are a test of manoeuvrability not outright speed. Small hatchback cars tend to prevail as outright winners although sports cars can also win outright in drier conditions and slightly more open tests, but it's fun competing in any class against similar vehicles. Almost all cars have an available class, but it does, as a sport, suit slightly older cars as most modern cars have too many electronic driver aids which can hamper your progress if they can't be easily immobilised. But in essence any car with decent road tyres on the driven wheels and an efficient handbrake can be loads of fun.

Test diagrams are made available in advance (as seen here and on the following page) and will show a route around the course in a forward (solid line) or reverse (dotted line) direction and indicate where to stop and where to change direction. The most basic events are likely to be all forwards easy to remember tests whilst others may include several forward/reverse manoeuvres and can test your memory and your driving ability. All tests can be walked at the start of the event, and this is strongly advised, reducing your chance of a memory failure once you're in competition. Time penalties are applied for striking a marker or taking a wrong route, but you do get 2



or 3 chances at each test with your worst time discounted from the results.




Usually there would be 6 test routes on an evening event and 12 on an all-day event and these could be anything between 25 seconds and a minute, maybe longer.

At the end there will be an award for the fastest overall time and the winners of each class. These are fun events that you can treat as light heartedly or as seriously as you want, above all they are friendly and

advice for the novice is freely available. Alternatively, you can see what it's all about by marshalling before you take the plunge, all these events rely on people freely giving their time to allow others to compete.

So that's it, grass autotests, we're at the end of the season now but watch out next month when I'll cover hard surface events which are more prevalent during the winter months.

Are you considering buying second hand tyres?

I came across an article in a car magazine warning against buying second hand tyres.

Research carried out by Tyresafe.org paints a torrid picture of the current state of the market. Although based on a small number of tyres it shows just how risky buying used tyres can be. Of the 50 tyres tested only one was offered in compliance with legal requirements.

- 94% of tyres inspected were being sold illegally.
- 93% of retailers were non-compliant.
- 63% of the tyres were unsafe for road use.
- Whilst 22% were over 10 years old, the age varied up to one tyre which was 29 years old.

Warcop Rangers 2 – Old Gits 0

Another old git saga from Bill Cook

It started way back on August Bank Holiday in 2021 when we made the long trek up to Cumbria to contest the Pendragon Stages with 70 miles of stages held over Warcop army ranges, and a cracking good event it was consisting of 4 stages run in the morning and then reversed in the afternoon. We completed the morning stages without a problem but when we tried going the opposite way we found a corner, just over a brow, which we arrived at way too fast and went far enough off that the organisers thought the car was well out of the way and so did not attempt recovery until the end of the event!



Due to venue availability the Pendragon did not run in 2022 or 2023, but this year it was on again and so once again we headed North for the August Bank Holiday weekend.

We set off from Somerset on Thursday to both miss the Bank Holiday traffic and break the journey with an overnight stop in my old Haunt of Cheshire combined with catching up with some old mates over a beer. Meanwhile, co-driver Rob Thompson drove all the way up in a single hit on Friday and we met up at Kirkby Stephen on Friday evening.

Saturday was a leisurely morning followed by scrutineering where we met up with our service crew of Kelvin and Rick – AKA The Chuckle Brothers. Once the formalities were complete, we de-camped up onto the ranges to bag a decent service spot before partaking of food and beer in the Crown and Cushion in Appleby, Westmoreland.

Sunday was an early start as car one was away at 08:12 and with cars starting at 30 second intervals it only took 45mins to get all the cars away. The first stage was around 8 miles which included a double lap of a large part of it meaning cars were effectively only 15 seconds apart. It was also very narrow and twisty for large parts of it making overtaking impossible for some long sections. We had a spin on a particularly gravelly corner and a minor off on a slippy square left. We were caught by 2 cars, and we also caught 2 cars effectively giving us a 'net zero'. Stage 2 was a repeat of stage one but with a few spots of rain and we caught and passed 2 more cars. Stage 3 was only slightly different in layout but significantly different in weather as it was now raining quite hard. Stage 4 was a repeat of 3 and although we started well, we succumbed to what I initially thought was a puncture. I pulled over and got out only to find all 4 tyres fully inflated, so we got back in and crawled through to the finish, missing out the second lap.



The car was giving all the signs of a broken drive shaft, but we crept up to the exit of the venue where there was a slight incline to join the A66 back to service. But that was it, the car just would not rise to the occasion – literally – and so we ended our rally there.

The Chuckle brothers recovered us, and we trailered the car back to the service area where we changed into dry clothes and had some lunch before setting off south. Due to the fact we had already taken a maximum and cars were already starting stage, 5 plus it was still raining we did not even look to see what the problem was.

We made an overnight stop on the journey south (one of the advantages of a motorhome) and when Bank Holiday Monday dawned dry and sunny I did peer under the car and was shocked to find the nearside axle tube had been ripped off the diff housing!!

Back home and the 2-piece axle has been removed and I'm now on the lookout for a replacement Sunbeam Lotus axle, which is not quite the same as a non-Lotus Sunbeam, so, if you happen to have one lurking at the back of the garage give me a shout.
