Blackpalfrey's unique Sunday morning Regularity Runs usually include two timed-to-the-second regularity sections typical of an historic road rally, over a road route of around 60 miles.

These events are open to members of the Blackpalfrey MC, the HRCR, the Weald MC, the MGCC and the TR Register. The events are suitable for 'older' and 'newer' cars and are designed to be good fun and good navigation practice.

### A short tribute to the late John Fowler

Many Blackpalfrey members and friends will remember John Fowler, a Regulatory competitor for many years in his A40s with Tom Ash, who sadly died 4 years ago. I'd known him since 1967 when he started work at Southwark as a student when I'd just qualified as a 'Public Health Inspector'. We shared a similar interest in cars and bought and sold each other's cars for several years. I introduced him to Borough 19 when he selfbuilt an Autocross mini, which he towed on a 2-wheel trailer behind his 1275 GT. The 1275 GT became his 1st rally car when joining Blackpalfrey with Tony Rowe navigating. Tom Ash will have many tales of their exploits, and I shared John in several scatter rallies in the 80s/90s.

His only son David didn't follow in his footsteps, teaching himself guitar in his early teens, he played his 1<sup>st</sup> paid gig for me as Project X on my 40th celebration (1986) where, as a 6<sup>th</sup> form band, they played Queen and Led Zeppelin! He's risen to great heights playing with many well-known artists and now tours the world as lead guitarist with The Australian Pink Floyd, currently on tour in UK at major venues David has a collection of nearly 50 guitars [must have sold John's Ferrari!]

### Autotests: Part Two

#### Grahame Standen completes our Autotest guide reviewing hard surface tests

Following on from last month's Autotest guide covering grass autotests, we're now moving on to hard surface autotests (usually tarmac or concrete, I'm going to call them tarmac for the purpose of this article) and their big brother, the Autosolo.



Now, most of the description for tarmac autotests is the same as for the grass variety covered last month, in fact the rules as set out by MSUK are identical, so you can expect the same, nearly.... Generally, these are a small step up so expect some bigger tests with a few more manoeuvres and a bit more reversing, so walking the tests beforehand is more important to commit the route to memory. You'll also be going a little faster with a higher grip level, but still only in first or reverse gears.

These events are suitable for most cars, so small hatchbacks and sports cars prevail but they are harder on the car generally, especially

on the transmission and tyres with much more grip available and more changes in direction. You are still using road pattern tyres though, but expect some wear, especially on airfield venues which are particularly abrasive, and a hydraulic handbrake is useful but not essential for the tighter turns, along with power steering.

Cost on these events is typically a little higher, no evening events are available, so it's a full day for a £40 to £50 entry fee plus your usual expenses and a slightly higher tyre bill. Everything else is the same; classes, route markers, penalties and opportunities for junior drivers and most of all it's still good fun and very friendly.

A step, or several steps above these, there is a national autotest championship, not for the faint hearted, even longer more complicated tests and specially developed cars, still in the same class structure, often very lightweight and usually featuring 2-speed gearboxes, that's just forward and reverse. A joy to watch if you get the opportunity.

Moving on to the big brother, Autosolos, that's bigger tests, all forwards, always on a sealed surface and opportunities to get into 2<sup>nd</sup> or maybe 3<sup>rd</sup> gear. A relatively new offshoot from autotests specifically designed for standard(ish) cars which must be driven to the event (no trailers). There are specific regulations relating to the severity of turns and the distance between said turns so it can all be negotiated in a standard car of

generally any size, free from any specialist modifications.

Aside from that, many of the rules set out by MSUK are similar, if not the same, as autotests, a similar class structure, penalties for wrong routes or striking a marker and opportunities for junior drivers. There is however a variation in the way the course is defined, you will have a diagram, and you still need to walk the test beforehand but each marker cone will be numbered or lettered in sequence and a further cone laid adjacent on its side clarifies which side of the marker you should pass.





These will be all day events for an entry fee of £50 to £75 but with a wider range on the number of tests available and how many opportunities you get to do each test, usually 2 or 3 runs at each, but often every time counts so you need to be on your game from the start. There are tyre rules, so no racing or track day tyres are allowed just a high wear rate on your normal road tyres to factor into your costs.


As with autotests your day will finish with awards for fastest time of the day and for the class winners, but most of all with a big smile on your face from a day of friendly competition taken as light heartedly or as seriously as you want.

Locally, the next Autosolo will be on 19th October and Tarmac Autotest on 16th November both at Ashford Cattle Market followed by further events at Brands Hatch in the new year. Keep an eye on the forthcoming events section in future editions of Highway.

If you want to have a look and see what these fun events are about before taking the plunge, why not volunteer to do a bit of marshalling first, it's the best way to learn about it and get up close and personal to all the action.







### 'It's in the genes' – my induction into Motorsport A reflection from Alan Blissett

I guess motorsport was in my blood! Dad Les and his brother Len were into speedway along with pit mechanic 'Jock', and with a surfeit of tracks local to Brixton it was an affordable pastime as a spectator. Pre WW2 there were at least 6 tracks in South London: Brixton, New Cross, Catford, Crystal Palace, Croydon and Wimbledon. Dad and his friend Jock also rode their Nortons in scrambling events at Layhams Farm Biggin Hill, Brands Hatch (anticlockwise) Canada Heights Swanley in the late 1930's, and Lydden in the 1950's. His



two younger brothers were into cycling and rode at Herne Hill. When Dad traded in his Norton & side frame (variously used for trails bike, sidecar and banana boxes for fruit & veg business) in 1951 for a Ruby 7 (see photo left) we would travel to Crystal Palace and Brands Hatch to watch the motor racing.

My first real memories of Motor Racing are the annual Boxing Day meetings at Brands Hatch from 1954, the smell of Castrol R from the Formula Juniors and the oddity of road saloons racing and leaning over around Paddock Bend where we always stood. Crystal Palace wasn't far from home by bike or No 3 bus from Brixton, so I was able to venture there from 1957 with my elder brother. He, having started work, took me to the 6-hour saloon race at Brands for my birthday in 1962 (train to Swanley then free courtesy bus!). We were both into cycling and I joined DeLaune Cycling Club with some of my school mates, which took us onto Crystal Palace Race circuit for a team event in 1962.

#### 1960's

I had been learning to drive off-road since I was 14 (1960) in Dads A40 Farina, as my uncle was market gardener to Lord Colgraine with a vast Estate 'Everlands' near Sevenoaks with estate roads to each lodge. Having passed my driving test in 1963, my instructor (a police driver friend of Dad) entered me into the 'young driver of the year' competition at Crystal Palace, which included a forward autotest on the police training skidpan near 'the Pylon'. My recently acquired a Triumph Herald (Ex Alan Woods who lived opposite and joined the Army) was not up to the job against Minis, Imps and 1100's. Working for Southwark Council from 1963, I joined the Civil Service Motor Club, to experience similar events.

After a couple of years earning £££s as a Trainee Public Health Inspector (and from gigs with my band) I was travelling to training in Tottenham and Watford and regularly passed Kennings forecourt in Hendon, where amongst all the used 1100s was a 1961 Mini-Cooper which I just had to have. The CSMC held a Clubman's Saloon Race in 1965 at the Palace; having obtained an RAC competitors licence I was able to enter without any need in those days for ARDs, only a full road license being over 18, a safety helmet (borrowed), no overalls and not even a rollover hoop, just removal of hub-caps and taped over headlights – I was off on my foray into real Motorsport'. *(See page 17 for a photo – Alan is behind the Imp!)* I formed a long-term acquaintance in the paddock with Eric Hall – Healey Elliot who worked at Southwark in the Planning Dept, Chris Craft – Orange! Lotus Cortina, latterly Broadspeed Escort T/C XOO341F, and his friend Alain de Cadenet. Raced against Terry Harmer, Rob Mason & Ken Costello. I also rubbed shoulders with Alan Mann, with his red & gold Lotus Cortinas before the famous Escorts.

#### 1965-1970s

Following a few Navigational Rallies with CSMC, I joined Blackpalfrey MC of Kent in 1965 encouraged by Chris & John Betson (MGA Mk11) which took me and Mini deeper into Road Rallying/Navigating (Hughes, Harold Sharp, Grasshopper), Autocross (Detling, Bredhurst, Staplehurst, Cobham) Car Trials (Tyrwhitt Drake, Mereworth Woods), and a short foray into Clubman's Rallycross which I had followed since the inaugural meeting at Lydden Feb 1967. Several of my acquaintances from Autocross; Roy Edwards (Tun Tyres Mini) Rod Chapman (Mk11 Cortina/Escort), and Mike Butler (R8 Gordini) were competing. I was an active participant in a whole range of motorsport sport both



on and off-road until 1971, using a series of Minis and Twin Cam Escort, when having purchased a house in Kent and getting married, I cut my costs and moved into navigating only until 1979. Once navigating for Chris Sclater (Allards of Brixton) in ex- works Twin Cam XOO354F when Martin Holmes was ill.

#### 1980s - 1990s

Equipped with Ex Irish Rally prepared Mini 1975 GT (Ex Tony Rowe/John Fowler Bp members) it was back to Rallying, Autotests and PCTS. I joined Borough 19 (Bromley Motor Club) in 1979 (at an award evening in Bromley Common – Bill Cook also won a class award at the same time – Stone Lodge event) They were more local than Blackpalfrey and I soon became a member of the event organising Committee (served 40 years till

Covid). B19 had a number of members participating in Rallycross in the lower classes, and having never missed an event at Lydden save for 1974-77 when my children were born, our group ventured wider afield than Lydden, including Cadwell, Croft, Nutts Corner, Mondello, Pembury, Anglesey and Valkensward (Holland), with my occasional use of our shared Mini & Metro, for RallyX, Sprinting and Hillclimbs, the latter two which were sparking more interest, as less damaging to the cars. I became more of the Rallycross Team Manager with an Entrants Licence 1987-96 – 'Last Minit Racing' was formed Matt Osborne driving and Orpington Car Stereo/Kenwood sponsoring.





I concentrated my driving on tarmac speed events in a series of 3 Fiestas – sponsored by Arlington Associates (and an occasional loaned Mini), which took me to South East venues like Valance, Bodiam, Pestalozzi, but also Goodwood, Lydden, Hethel, Snetterton, Mallory and Olivers Mount (Scarborough), I was quite successful. I did the occasional Nat B race in single make series under my MSA Clubmans Race/ Speed Nat B licence. I also participated as Driver or Navigator in a series of Scatter Rallies during the 1980's/1990's using Mini, Capri, Mk3 Escort, Sierra – with Tom Ash, John Fowler, Mike Bedwell, Sue Speller and in Julians deM's Alpha GTV, on Blackpalfrey's Scatter nominally called 'The Hughes' we won in 1986 and got a brass replica scale Concord!

In 1990 I acquired Steve Preston's race Mini, which had been modified and lightened with glass fibre panels and installed an Allegro 1500 engine. Alas this succumbed to severe structural front-end damage in 1992, and had to be re-shelled with a much-modified shell from Jonspeed. This process took an inordinate amount of time, due to funding and other developing motorsport roles. It was not very competitive on 13 x 7 wheels and was rarely used and sold on to a sprinter in 2002.



#### **Officials Roles 1993-Current**

I took on several MSA officials' roles as Clerk of Course AutoX, Sprint/ Hillclimb, and Rallycross\* which I held between 1995 and 2008 (\*from 2000). As a qualified CIEH Environmental Health Inspector, I became a Noise Test Official/ Environmental Scrutineer for Rally/Race/RallyX from 1993. I was Principal Env. Srut for National RallyCross Championships & British rounds of European RallyX, with an FIA International License. In 2012 I was appointed by Motor Sport Association Environmental Inspector, only 2 of us now nationally! and although we had regions of responsibility – East & Southeast England, it looks like I cover all Circuits of Cadwell as far as training and overseeing Environmental Scrutineers.

#### 1996-2002 International Rallying



With my long-term buddy Keith Oldfield moving permanently to Northern France we continued our partnership as driver/co-driver in a series of longdistance road rallies with the European Endurance Club, mostly assembling and starting from Liege. 1996 to Budapest (Hungary) & 1997 to Agadir (Morrocco) (see photo left) using an Oldfield built Citroen Special -sponsored by Erith Haulage, 1999 to Italy/Sardina/Sicily in Oldfields built 1930's Bellini

replica, 2000 – The Welsh in a Puma, 2002 Arras (France) to Kandersteg (Swizt) in a his Matra Mureno/Alpha. In 1998 the EEClub event was to Benghazi, Instead I went with Venture Reprieve to Romania as navigator in restored 1953 single-deck London Country bus! Accounts of both the Morocco Rally and Venture Reprieve have previously been published in Highway. We have periodically used Keith LHD Mk11 Escort in Europe in the 2000's.





#### 2020 – Current HRCR Road Rally /Tours

With my trusty 50+ year old Historically Registered Minivan, I have embarked on a series of 100+ navigational tours in the South East and Home Counties introducing new (old) colleague Barry Shaw, and son Noel to the skills of navigating. The minivan has also participated in the annual London to Brighton mini-run for the past 10 years and Brands Hatch and Brooklands mini-festivals to name a few.

Myself, as a life member of Goodwood, from 1998, I now have a trackside brass-plaque near the chicane. *(see right)*.

### Weald Motor Club 12 Car Rally Beginners Training Report on Session One, 11 September 2024 (organised by BPMCK)

The first of Weald Motor Clubs 12 car rally training sessions was very successful with a total of nine potential new competitors making use of the free tutorial.

The evening, which was based at the Newnham Court Inn, Maidstone, started with a brief rundown on what to expect, which was led by Dick Athow, assisted by Steve Thompson. Afterwards, the beginners were each assigned an expert driver and navigator to sit in the car with them as they attempted to navigate a 15-mile circular route on a marked map. The route was non-competitive, untimed, and was designed to give the beginners a 'feel' for what to expect on a competitive event, while building on the aspects of teamwork and communication. All crews successfully made it around the route, visiting four manned controls and two unmanned passage checks en-route, as well as adhering to quiet zones where required.

All crews then returned to the Newnham Court Inn for a debrief followed by a Question-and-Answer session, which proved useful for both the beginners and the organisers, giving us a few ideas to carry forward into the future sessions.

Session 2 is planned to take place on the 30<sup>th</sup> October 2024 and will be run by Maidstone & Mid Kent Motor Club. Venue to be confirmed. See page 14 for more information.


